A quick patrol of our label artwork will uncover clips from Pa Conway's actual Ireland-to-U.S.A. immigration papers from 1903. And because his traffic beat neighbored our Ohio City brewery, his grandsons Pat and Dan literally follow in his bluecoat footsteps every day. Each year Cleveland hosts Ohio's largest and oldest St. Patrick's Day celebration, and Conway's Irish Ale makes a perfect pairing.

ABOUT THE STYLE:

Irish Red Ale was first made popular by the G.H. Lett Brewery of Enniscorthy, County Wexford, Ireland. It's an easy-drinking ale with low aroma and a medium-light malt-forward body, often with sweet toffee, biscuit, and caramel flavor notes. Light on bitterness but packed with warming malt flavors, the Irish Red continues to win over new and seasoned beer drinkers.
